1. Minimise soil disturbance
2. If in doubt DON'T pull it out!
3. Tread Carefully

Weed	Name	Weeding Method
	<p>Perennial veldt grass Bluey green foliage with reddish/purple nodes</p>	<p>Very young can be carefully teased from soil . Larger - cut roots with knife under crown.</p>
	<p>Annual veldt grass Lime green foliage</p>	<p>Very young can be carefully teased from soil . Larger - cut roots with knife under crown.</p>
	<p>Common Sow Thistle Lower plant with flat, lime green foliage.</p>	<p>Very young can be carefully teased from soil . Larger - cut roots with knife under crown.</p>
	<p>Geranium Fan shaped, light green flat, serrated leaf, soft and furry to touch</p>	<p>Can be carefully teased from soil with minimum soil disturbance.</p>

Weeding Method



Common Groundsel

Dark, long, wider, serrated leaf and small yellow flower

Very young can be carefully teased from soil . Larger - cut roots with knife under crown.



Ursinia

Asparagus/ Fennel-like leaf. Lower part of stem red/rust coloured. When in flower -yellow daisy-like flowers

Can be carefully teased from soil with minimum soil disturbance.



Fumaria

Bright, light green foliage and may have either white or pink and claret flowers. Can form dense ground cover and scramble over shrubs and smother

Pulls out easily. Tease out with minimal soil disturbance.



Storksbill

Flat spreading with geranium-like leaves and small mauve flowers

Very young can be carefully teased from soil . Larger - cut roots with knife under crown.
