



ORCHIDS IDENTIFIED BY THE FRIENDS (2000-2022)

Name	Notes	Last recorded sighting
1. Caladenia discoidea	Bee orchid – only 5 or 6 places	
2. Caladenia ferruginea	Rusty spider orchid (LHS path from ovals) 2004	
3. Caladenia filifera	Blood spider orchid only 1 seen in 2000	
4. Caladenia flava	*Cowslip, common	Spring 2022
5. Caladenia georgei	Tuart spider orchid (not confirmed)	
6. Caladenia huegelii	*Not seen since 2000 and Jay Barnett notes this may be confused with more common <i>C. longiclavata</i>	
7. Caladenia latifolia	Only seen one near fire break in 2005, pink fairy orchid	Spring 2022, large clump near CT entry
8. Caladenia longicauda	*Common, white spider orchid long petals	
9. Caladenia longiclavata	Clubbed spider orchid	
10. Caladenia macrostylis	Leaping spider orchid	
11. Caladenia marginata	White fairy orchid; found by Robin Roe 2004	
12. Cyanicula sericea	Only three places – silky blue orchid	
13. Diuris brumalis	Winter donkey orchid	Spring 2022
14. Diuris magnifica	Pansy orchid, 3 large patches seen over a few years	Spring 2022
15. Elythranthera brunonis	Purple enamel orchid; found by Robin Roe 2004	2004
16. Eriochilus r	Bunny Orchid. Leaves identified by Jon Warren Spring 2022	Spring 2022
17. Microtis media	*Mignonette orchid, common	Spring 2022
18. Pheladenia deformis	Blue fairy orchid (Note name change)	
19. Pterostylis dilatata	Robust snail orchid, first seen Sept 2001	Spring 2022
20. Pterostylis recurva	Jug orchid, only 1 seen by 2005	Spring 2022, in two areas
21. Pterostylis sanguinea	Dark banded greenhood, common	
22. Pterostylis vittata	*Banded greenhood, common	Spring 2022
23. Pyrorchis nigricans	Red beaks; found by Robin Roe 2004	Spring 2022
24. Thelymitra macrophylla	Large-leafed sun orchid; not seen 2000-2002	Spring 2022
25. Thelymitra graminea	Shy sun orchid (Identified and photographed by Jay Barnett 2002) or possibly <i>T. crinita</i>	Spring 2022
